BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

Marking the 70th anniversary of Korean independence, the Institute of Foreign Affairs and National Security (IFANS) of the Korea National Diplomatic Academy (KNDA) is organizing *2015 IFANS Conference on Global Affairs*. The conference will be held on October 23, 2015 in Seoul, and will bring together internationally known scholars from countries in and out of the Northeast Asian region, as well as representatives of relevant academia and think-tanks.

It might be an irony that our age of enhanced interconnectivity would be an era of so many simultaneous challenges and crises. Around Korean Peninsula we see a region strained under symptoms of discord and disorder. More specifically, the Northeast Asia has longstanding problems, such as the North Korean nuclear issue, as well as territorial, historical tensions and nationalism.

Moreover, we now live in more turbulent times. The Northeast Asia is now facing a number of multi-layered and complex challenges than ever before. Replacing tensions and distrust with trust and reconciliation is especially meaningful this year, as we mark the 70th anniversary of Korean independence.

The 70th anniversary of Korean independence also means the 70th year of the division of the Korean peninsula, which already holds the record for the longest armistice in contemporary history. This means that the true and ultimate liberation of Korea will remain unfulfilled unless we are one people again.

It is at this juncture that the IFANS convenes 2015 IFANS Conference on Global Affairs in an effort to explore ways to turn these daunting challenges into opportunities. The primary objective of the conference is to provide an opportunity to critically reflect on the emerging diplomatic challenges around the Korean Peninsula and to explore future diplomatic pathways for Korea.

History is replete with ups and downs, progressions and retrogressions. However, there is no denying the progress made in South Korea - in terms of the establishment of democracy and economic prosperity. As Korea transformed challenges into opportunities for growth, it will be able to overcome current challenges and chart its own diplomatic path for the 21th century.

2015 IFANS Conference on Global Affairs will serve as a momentum to ruminate on the 70-year-history of Korea's diplomacy and to provide advice on the ways forward.
