

# OASIS-3 Intellectual Property Application Support and Prototype Production Support: the Korea Invention Promotion Association

- Provide support in the intellectual property application process for outstanding items (ideas) with creativity
- Provide expenses for acquiring the rights of the ideas {application fee (written opinion can be supported), agent commission} within the given range, one time per person, and only for patent, utility model and design (trademark is excluded)
- Select technologies (ideas) applied or registered with high commercialization possibility through public contests and support for commercialization and model production, one time per person.

# OASIS-4 Basic Start-up Class (25 points): Korea Immigration Service Foundation, Seoul Global Center

- Basic start-up course for foreigners equipped with basic technologies for a business start-up
- A total of 20 hours (2 hours a day, 3 weeks), all courses are provided in a proper language for participants and a minimum of 80% attendance is required for the course completion

#### OASIS-5 Start-up Coaching & Mentoring (15points): Korea Immigration Service Foundation, Seoul Global Center

- Provide a professional coaching and mentoring service on the issues necessary for a business start-up including selecting a location, market research and customer analysis
- Minimize start-up failure rate early on through one-on-one coaching from a start-up immigration mentor or experts, experience sharing, and site visits
- A minimum of 10 hours (3 sessions) of exclusive coaching and mentoring is recognized as points.

#### OASIS-6 Invention, Start-up Exhibition (required) (25 points): Co-hosting

- Find opportunities to identify foreigner's creative intellectual property ideas and start-up
- tems, open sales channels, and connect investors, etc.
   Find opportunities to identify outstanding and inventive start-up items of potential immigrant entrepreneurs, etc. and to promote technology transaction and investment counseling among participants
- Provide opportunities for participants to take part in inventions and start-up exhibitions held by universities that attract international students, to meet with company-affiliated research institutions and invested companies, etc. and to give prize to awarded participants.

#### **OASIS-7** Graduation from Start-up Incubation (Provide a space for Start-up) (15 points): Korea Immigration Service Foundation, Seoul Global Center

- Provide a stable start-up environment by giving a space to individuals who are prepared for a business start-up
- Provide a space for initial start-up to individuals who have completed support programs for intellectual property rights and start-up with outstanding performance or those who have received awards at invention/start-up exhibitions
- Graduation is recognized only after six months have passed since the start-up moved in the start-up incubation.

#### **OASIS-8** Support for corporation establishment: Korea Immigration Service Foundation

- Support the establishment of corporation, which is imperative to achieve a start-up visa (D-8-4) for successful start-up immigration
- Support preparation procedure and administrative affairs for corporation establishment to help foreigners obtain a start-up visa(D-8-4)
- Comprehensive assistance in administration and corporate registration required to establish a corporation

#### **OASIS-9** Support Start-up Items Commercialization (required) (25 points): Korea Institute of Start-up and Entrepreneurship Development, Korea Techno-Venture Foundation, Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology

- Promote successful start-up immigration with policy support for start-ups at early stages
- Provide initial commercialization expenses as well as support R&D and post-management
   Select start-up visa(D-8-4) holders who are to start-up a business or have been in business for less than three years since start-up establishment

### Revised guidelines on Job Seeker (D-10) Visa Issuance and Sojourn Management (Technology-based Start-up)

#### Eligible applicants and range of activities

- (Eligible applicants) Persons who plan to prepare for establishment of a technology-based start-up and fall under Item C of 17. Corporate / Foreign Investor (D-8) of Table 1 of the Enforcement Decree of the Immigration Control Act (Visa code: D-8-4)
- \* Corporate founders recognized by the Minister of Justice who have earned a bachelor's degree or higher and own either intellectual property rights or the equivalent technological capacity (Immigrants who start up a technology-based business)
- (Range of activities) Overall start-up preparation activities for participation in start-up immigration education programs, application for intellectual property rights including patents, and establishment of corporations

#### 2. Visa issuance

- (Eligible applicants) Persons who have earned (or are expected to earn) a bachelor's degree or higher and prepare for a business start-up based on intellectual property rights or the equivalent technology
- (Issuance Standards) Persons who meet one of the following requirements:
- Who own or have applied for patent rights, utility model rights or design rights among intellectual property rights
- Who have completed or participated in all or part of Overall Assistance for Start-up Immigration System (OASIS) courses offered by the Global Startup Immigration Center, designated by the Ministry of Justice and the Small and Medium Business Administration

- If an applicant does not satisfy one of the above requirements, a technology-based start-up plan should be submitted for a comprehensive review of the relevance between a major and start-up area as well as expenses required for a business start-up in order to issue a visa.
- (Required documents) A certificate of education, technology-based start-up plan, a copy of a certificate of patent, utility model registration or design registration or a certificate of application for a patent, etc. (where applicable), and a certificate proving that the person has completed or participated in OASIS courses (where applicable)

#### 3. Extension of stay

- (Required documents) A written plan for job seeking or technology-based business start up activities (The documents should include the history of the job seeking or start-up
- preparation activities for the latest 6 months as well as future plans)
- (Maximum period of stay) A maximum of two years for persons who own or have applied
  for patent rights, utility model rights or design rights, or who earned 50 points or higher
  from the start-up immigration points system (a maximum of one year for other cases)
- The history of the relevant activities (job seeking and technology-based start-up preparation) and the future plans is comprehensively reviewed, and if appropriate, the stay period will be extended for six months at a time within the period of stay.

#### 4. Change of status of stay

- (Eligible applicants) Persons who have earned (or are expected to earn) a bachelor's degree or higher from a Korean or foreign university and prepare for a business start-up based on intellectual property rights or the equivalent technology
- (Required documents) A certificate of education (bachelor's degree or higher), technology
  -based start-up plan, a copy of a certificate of patent, utility model registration or design
  registration, or a copy of certificate or a receipt of application for a patent, etc. (where
  applicable), and a certificate proving that the person has completed or participated in
  OASIS courses (where applicable)

# Revised Standards on International Trade (D-9-5) Visa

- (Standards) Student (D-2) or Job Seeker (D-10) visa holders who have earned (are expected to earn) a master's degree or higher from a Korean university, and have completed business registration according to the Value-added Tax Act and plan to manage a company or engage in a commercial business after investing 100 million KRW or more (Capital raised in Korea is recognized up to 50 million KRW but the rest must be foreign capital in accordance with the Foreign Exchange Transactions Act and the Regulations.)
- However, persons who have earned (are expected to earn) a bachelor's degree from a Korean university and gained 40 points or higher from the OASIS 1 through 8 are eligible to apply for a D-9-5 visa.

# Revised standards on Permanent Resident (F-5) Visa for Start-up Visa (D-8-4) Holders (Technology-based Start-up)

• (Standards) Persons who have stayed in Korea for at least three years on a start-up visa (D-8-4), attracted 300 million KRW or more from investors and hired two or more Korean employees

#### Applicants must have

- stayed in Korea for at least three years on a start-up visa(D-8-4) as of the date of permanent resident visa application.
- attracted 300 million KRW or more from global investors or obtained the equivalent capital.
- employed at least two Korean nationals for six months or more as of the date of permanent resident visa application.
